
# **News from Undergraduate Research Supporters**

Applications are now open for Wege Prize, an international team-based competition where students identify a problem and work to develop a circular design solution built on the three principles of a circular economy: eliminate waste and pollution, keep products and materials in use, regenerate our natural systems. Teams move through up to four phases working to further develop their solution with feedback from experts in in design, the circular economy, material science, agriscience, sustainable business, and more. Finalist teams present their ideas in Grand Rapids, Michigan in May (travel stipend provided) and compete for \$65,000 in cash awards. Applications are due October 6.
