NOMINEE STATEMENTS

Describe your leadership experience both within CUR and extramural.

I am currently serving in my sixth year as an elected leader within CUR. I first served as a division representative for the undergraduate research program division. With a change in roles at my university I moved into the Education Division in 2020, and I have served as a divisional representative, vice-chair, and councilor. I have been a member of the Nominations and Elections Committee as well as the Program Review Committee and I am currently on the subcommittee to streamline the Divisional Awards process.

Beyond CUR, I serve as a leader and advocate for undergraduate research, scholarship, and creative activity on my campus. I have received internal grants to conduct research on research, to better understand the barriers of entry into research experiences for education students. I have worked collaboratively with faculty across disciplines to disseminate on the outcomes of co-curricular and post-baccalaureate programming that aims to provide culturally sustaining research opportunities to students in STEM. In 2024, I worked with our Yuma campus to launch their local symposium and have led the efforts to expand the research offerings at NAU through course-based undergraduate research experiences. I have served as a reviewer for NCUR for multiple years.

How will your skills help the Council successfully uphold its charge?

As many in CUR, I am passionate about providing a supportive community of scholars to advance equitable access to research, scholarly, and creative activities at all higher education institutions. I feel my experience as a PhD student in education studying undergraduate research, the director of a centralized office of undergraduate research, and a long-standing member of CUR who has worked across divisions provide me a perspective on where we have been and the possibilities of where we might go. I am an active member of our division and feel I can adequately represent the needs, concerns, and direction of our group to both advise the Board on our needs as well as inform our division on the priorities of CUR and how our work may align.
