#### NOMINEE STATEMENTS

## Describe your leadership experience both within CUR and extramural.

Within CUR, I currently serve as a Division Representative and Secretary for the CUR Social Science Division. As secretary, I seek to highlight opportunities and resources for Social Science division representatives within the division, within CUR as a whole, and beyond the organization. I also seek to showcase the undergraduate research and experiential learning our members develop, coordinate, and oversee, as well as their scholarship of teaching and learning related to undergraduate research. As secretary, I have conducted interviews with our members and spotlighted one member each month in order to create connection and community, even among members who may not yet have met in person. Within CUR I also serve on the Nominations and Leadership Development Committee (I will recuse myself from reviewing Councilor applications) and the Social Science Faculty Excellence in Mentorship Award Committee. I have also completed CUR's Inclusive Leadership Recruitment training. In 2024, I presented at ConnectUR, and served as the Social Science Division representative at the Open House.

At Valdosta State I have served in progressive leadership positions at the departmental and university level. From 2016-2023, I served as MS Sociology Coordinator within the Department of Sociology, Anthropology, and Criminal Justice. In this position, I developed a 4+1 Accelerated BA-to-MS degree program in collaboration with the BA Sociology & Anthropology program coordinator. After serving as MS Sociology coordinator for three years, I took on the additional leadership of our BA in Sociology & Anthropology program. I also co-established and co-directed a study abroad program to Ecuador offering coursework in sociology & anthropology, and led student participants to securing 7k in federal Gilman scholarships, as well as institutional support.

Currently, I serve as the university coordinator for the SACSCOC Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP), which provides students with a comprehensive offering of curricular and co-curricular experiential learning opportunities. These offerings are organized under the broad categories of research and creative inquiry, global citizenship, and servant leadership and community engagement, with each designed to engage students in a scaffolded approach to self-reflection and articulation of learning. As QEP Coordinator, I oversee tracking and assessment of all experiential learning, in collaboration with the experiential learning advisory team and an annual cohort of faculty experiential learning ambassadors. I also work closely with the Center for Excellence in Learning and Teaching in programming for faculty development in the theory and practice of experiential learning. In May 2024, we launched a faculty experiential learning certificate. I also chair our Blazer Summer Research Institute, which provides competitive funding for student-faculty teams to participate in mentored undergraduate research in a structured program.

# How will your skills help the Council successfully uphold its charge?

I believe that my experience serving as the Secretary for the Social Science Division (and particularly my interviews with the division members) has provided me with insight into the skills and deep knowledge the division and its longstanding members bring to the Council and the undergraduate research community as a whole, as well as the needs and concerns of new and prospective divisional representatives and more junior faculty. My institutional role of leading our QEP focused on experiential learning provides me with insight on how to best articulate how undergraduate research develops essential skills and provides readiness for careers and graduate school.
